It's hard to believe that we are a mere few days from the conclusion of another school year. While there are many things I could share, I am limited to the space on this page. Therefore, here's a quick, itemized list of things you need to know.

- PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT/EVALUATIONS*: Some changes are coming in the 2016-2017 school year. These changes include: moving from 4 evaluations to 3 (2 announced, 1 unannounced), adding a 10% weight to teachers' self-evaluation scores toward end-of-year score, and teacher input in professional development to better relate to what happens in the classroom. While these changes are overdue, in my humble opinion, I am grateful to the administration for listening to our collective voice and trying to ensure parity and fairness in implementing such a complex teacher improvement model that is TAP.
- PRELIMINARY BARGAINING: Recently, the Indiana Education Employment Relations Board (IEERB) deemed our negotiated agreement as "substantially compliant." While we have a couple of very minor issues to address in our language, resolving them should be expedient. Stay tuned for updates coming to you via email and/or Remind. If you have any suggested items for negotiations, contact Matt Henninger at PMHS directly.
- MEMBERSHIP: This year, PEA saw its third consecutive year of growth in our membership. This is, in large part, due to you, to our building reps, and to our membership chair, Jackie Miller. ISTA has endeavored to spark growth in all locals, and we have been used as a positive example in discussions statewide. We need to continue our growth. Therefore, we will have another member-incentive program at the beginning of next school year. Stay tuned for more details in July.
- SUMMER COMMUNICATION: While it is important for you to get away this summer and relax, recharge, and replenish yourselves, it is equally important for you to stay informed. We'll see the final stages of presidential campaigns forming; we'll be working on a new teacher contract, and more.
